

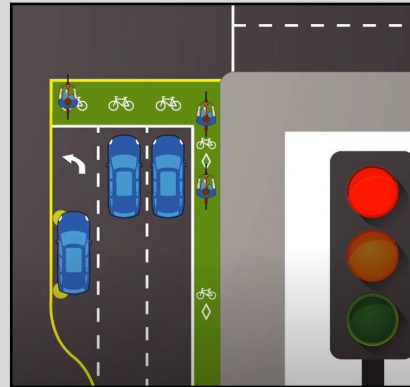
Bicycle Master Plan Implementation

On April 24, 2018, the City of San Ramon adopted the first Citywide Bicycle Master Plan! San Ramon aspires to encourage, motivate and accommodate bicycle riding for all ages and abilities. Below is a table that depicts all completed bike infrastructure projects since 2018.

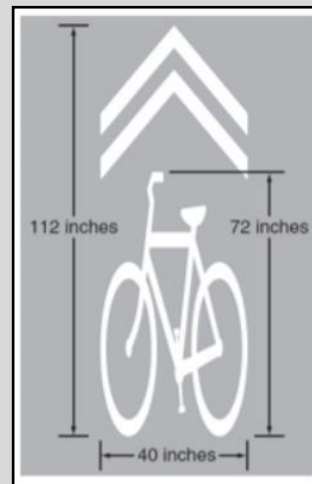

Green Bike Lane



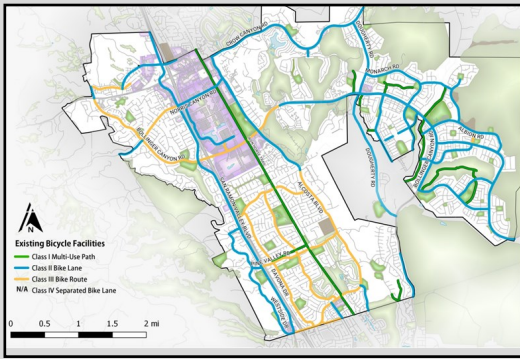

Buffered Bike Lanes

Class II Buffered Bike Lanes are implemented by painting or otherwise creating a buffer zone between a bicycle lane and the adjacent travel lane.

Green Conflict Markings

Green Conflict Markings, commonly known as “Conflict Zones” are colored markings that help alert vehicles of areas where the bicycle path and vehicle path intersect. Conflict Zones are used at intersections and major driveways, where a right turning vehicle would cross the through the bicycle movement.

Shared Lane Marking/Sharrows

Shared Lane Marking or “Sharrow” is a pavement marking used to indicate a shared lane environment for bicycles and automobiles. Among other benefits, Sharrows reinforce the legitimacy of bicycle traffic on the street, recommend proper bicyclist positioning to avoid hazards such as opening of doors from parked vehicles, provides a wayfinding guidance along bike routes, and reduces the incidence of wrong-way bicycling. The Sharrow has a variety of uses to support a complete bikeway network in San Ramon.

Bike Boxes

A Bike Box is a designated area between the limit line and the queue of stopped vehicles at a signalized intersection, which allows bicyclists in the bike lane to safely position themselves before making a left turn.

San Ramon Bike Infrastructure Stats

Since adoption of the Bicycle Master Plan, San Ramon has installed approximately 6,864 feet (1.3 mi.) of Shared Lane Markings and 104,500 feet (19.8 mi.) of buffered bike lanes, totaling 22 miles of improvement in the network, 2 new Class II bike lanes, and a bike box.
